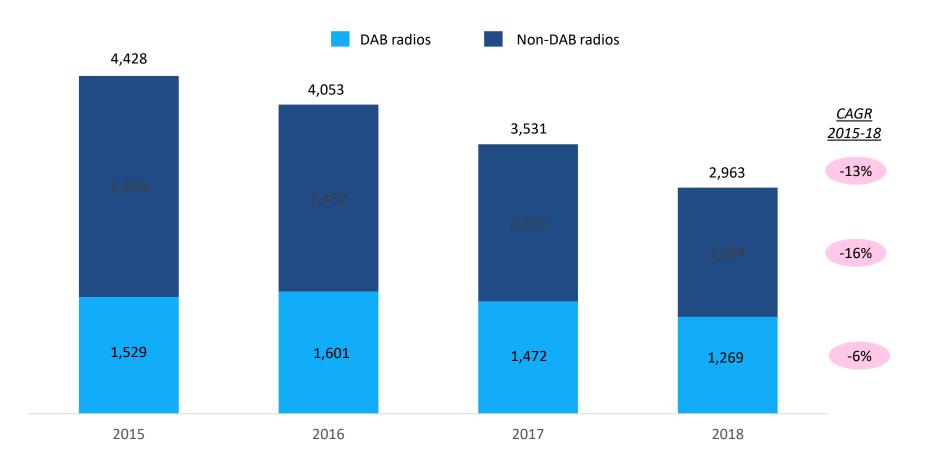

- Regulation that ensures all radio devices are digital

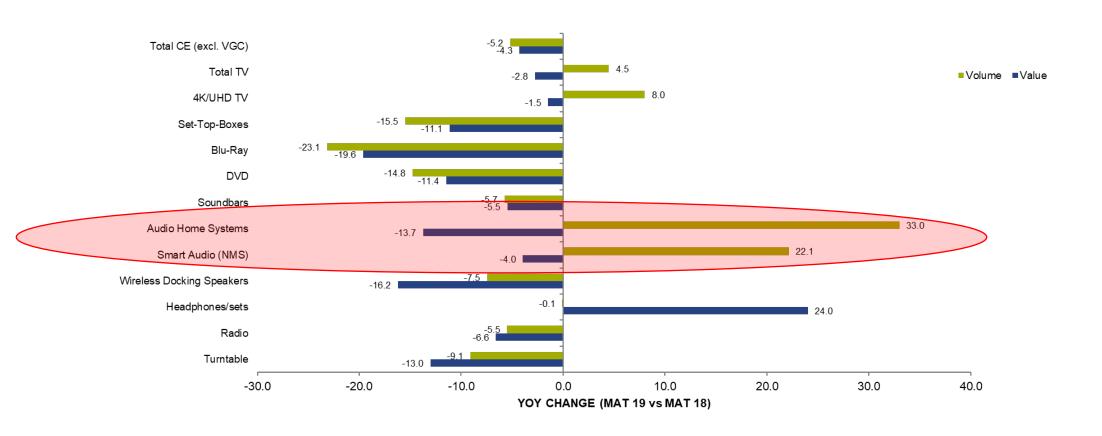


Radio Device Sales In Decline





Are Streaming Speakers the New Radios? GFK: UK 9/18 to 8/19



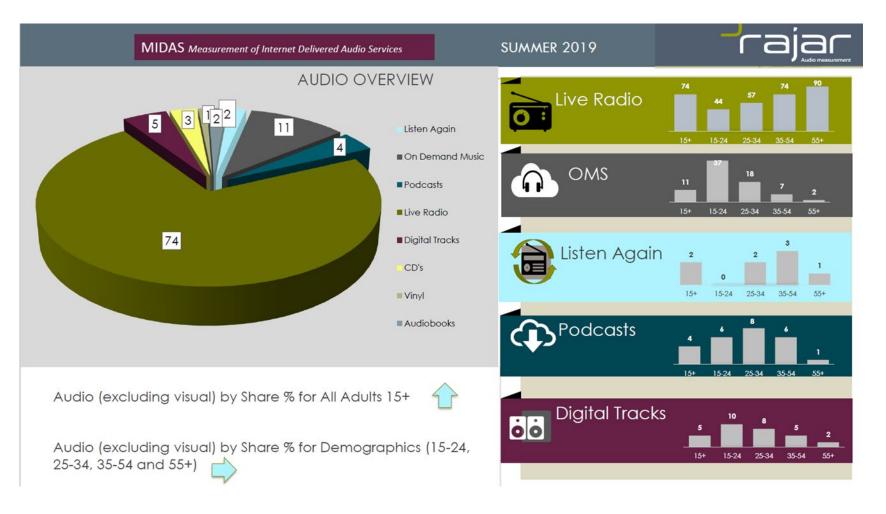


Digital Listening reaches 56.8% in Q3 2019 (RAJAR)

- Digital listening increases year on year to 56.8% up from 52.4% last year
- Overall digital listening grew by 24.1m hours (5% year on year)
- Listening via DAB grew by 2 million hours (0.5%) to now account for 39.7% of all listening & 70% of digital listening
- 28% of UK adults now claim to own a voice activated speaker
- Listening via online/apps grew by 22.5 million hours (or by 33%)
- Digital Listening in car grew by 15.2 million hours (17.4% year on year). 93% of new UK cars now come with DAB.



Live Radio is holding share of listening



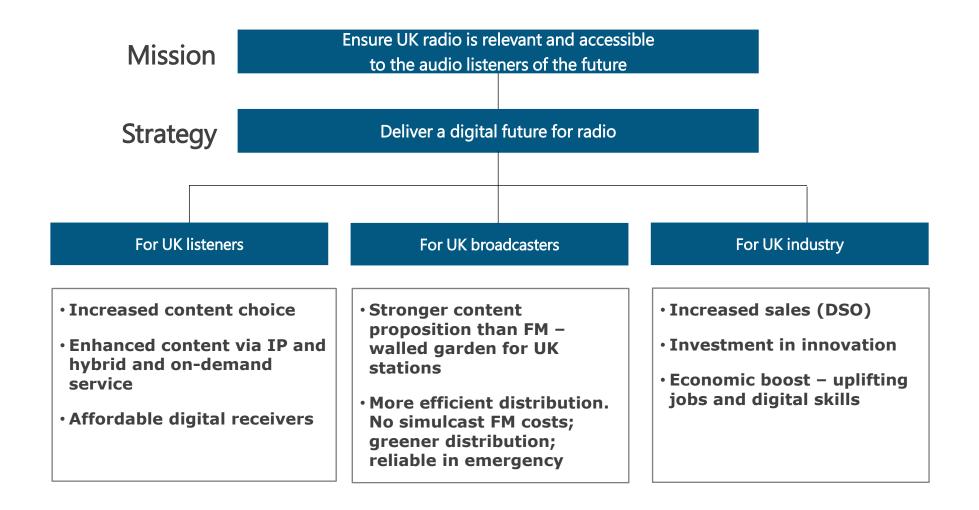


Government Backed Review Underway

- Joint Government/industry review to ensure a robust and vibrant future for UK radio and audio sector
- Three dedicated work-streams Listeners; Technology and Automotive;
 Networks and Distribution
- First phase of project initiation complete and work-streams signed off
- Final recommendations and actions report Oct 2020

Looking To The Future

- No appetite from some broadcasters to commit to a DSO
- Device manufacturers need to find revenue growth in non-radio categories (e.g. Streaming Speakers)
- Reluctance from broadcasters to invest more in DAB network
- Roll out of 5G likely to support further growth of IP radio services
- Digital receiver mandating for devices
